Parking Lot Safety and Reminders:

We take the safety of our students very seriously. Please remember when dropping off your student in the morning the left lane is a drive through lane only, the right lane drop off only. There is no parking, dropping off, or picking up of students in the bus loop. This area is specifically reserved for our buses. Please stay off of your phones in the parking lot and follow the directions of staff members helping with the flow of traffic and safety of your student. If you need to walk with your student to line up, please park in the neighborhood and walk.

Also, students should not be in the building or on the school grounds prior to 7:50 or after 2:45 without parent supervision or prior approval of a school staff member. Students should go straight home or to Before/After care when the bell rings. Beginning at 7:50 in the morning, we have staff supervision at all line-up points to help monitor student safety. Please contact our Before/After care program at 720-886-8370 if you must drop your students off before 7:30. They will be happy to assist you.

Attendance:

What does Cherry Creek School District consider an excused absence?

1. A student who is temporarily ill or injured, or whose absence is approved by the administrator of the school of attendance on a prearranged basis. Prearranged absences shall be approved for appointments or circumstances of a serious nature only which cannot be taken care of outside of school hours.
2. A student who is absent for an extended period of due to physical, mental or emotional disability.
3. A student who is pursuing a work-study program under the supervision of the school.
4. A student who is attending any school-sponsored activity or activities of an educational nature with advances approval by the administration.
5. A student who is absent in observance of an established religious holiday.
6. A student whose absence is approved by the building principal at the request of the parent or guardian.
7. A student who is suspended or expelled.

Cherry Creek Schools

School of Choice- If you are living within the boundaries of CCSD

The Cherry Creek School District allows its resident students to apply for enrollment in the Cherry Creek school/program of their choice. In other words, you may request that your child attend a Cherry Creek school outside your assigned attendance area. The School of Choice applications are an electronic application that you can access online during the month of **January** from any computer, at any time. Please note that there are **NO PAPER FORMS** available for the School of Choice application process.

There is a limit of one (1) application per student and all information is verified for accuracy. Applications are considered on a space available, lottery basis with priority given to families with siblings at the school and to the children of employees of the district.

Parents will be notified of the **decisions by March 15th** and any appeals must be submitted *in writing* to District Admissions by April 15th. The Appeals Committee will review all letters received, and parents will be notified of the final decision by May 15th.

Please note:

- Students currently attending a school under *School of Choice* or an *IntraDistrict Transfer* approved to the highest grade level do **NOT** need to submit an application to return to that school next year.
- **Non-Resident** student applications will be available online **starting April 1st**.
- Requests to attend preschool, charter schools (Cherry Creek Academy & Heritage Heights Academy) and a magnet school (Challenge School) do NOT use the School of Choice process. Please contact the school directly for assistance on their application process.
- There is not a specific "time" that the forms will be made available or removed on Feb 1, so please do not wait until the last minute to submit your application. Late applications cannot be accepted.
- The address you indicate on your form **must be current**, and **must be within the boundaries of Cherry Creek School District**.

CHERRY CREEK DISTRICT CHESS TOURNAMENT

Saturday, March 9, 2019

DIVISIONS: Grades K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Middle School (6-8), and High School (9-12). K & 1st Grade sections may be combined. Students must attend a school in the Cherry Creek School District to play. This is a non-rated tournament. Similar age groups may be combined. USCF rules will apply.

ENTRY FEE: \$20.00 per child. Registration fee waivers are available through the Cherry Creek Advanced Academic and Gifted Services Office (720-886-7050) for students who qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch (must submit a copy of the letter from Food Service). Money and registration **MUST** be received by **Saturday, March 2, 2019**. **There will be no on-site registration. No confirmation letters will be sent. Enroll early...tournament will be limited to the first 200 students who sign up.**

TIMES: Check in is 8:00 to 8:30 a.m. The Players Meeting is at 8:30 a.m. (All competitors must attend). Round 1 begins at 9:00 am. Each round will take approximately one hour. There will be no scheduled lunch break and no food will be provided. Players should bring their own sack lunch and snacks to eat in between rounds. This is a 5-round, non-elimination tournament - players should plan to participate in all five rounds. The tournament should end around 3:00-3:30.

TIME CONTROL: Time control is G/30 (30 minutes, per player, per game). A clock may be placed on games still in progress 40 minutes after the round start time, with each player getting 10 minutes. Most of the children are not experienced with chess clocks. We will explain how to use the clock to the children, as needed.

PRIZES: In each division, the top finishers will be awarded trophies. Participation awards will be given to non-trophy winners. Awards ceremony will follow the final round and will occur mid-late afternoon, after Round 5 is completed. Ties for trophies will be broken with the following tie-break systems: 1. Modified Median 2.Solkoff 3.Cumulative.

LOCATION: Overland High School, 12400 E. Jewel Ave; Aurora (Enter west side of Overland High School off Jewel Ave. (just east of Peoria St.), go south to the rear of Overland HS and park. Enter Overland HS from the south entrance.

SUPERVISION: Good behavior of all participants is expected. However, all players 12 years old and younger must have a parent/guardian present for the entire tournament. While parents are not allowed in the competition area once a round begins, parents are required to supervise their children between each round. If it becomes clear a child does not have supervision between rounds, he/she will forfeit the opportunity to compete further and will be asked to leave.

No confirmation letters will be sent. **Tournament will be limited to the first 200 students to sign up.** If you are late and sign up after the 200 players are registered, Todd will notify you on the phone number listed on your entry form. Your checks will be deposited in late February or early March.
